

Now to him who is able to keep you from falling, and to make you stand without blemish in the presence of his glory with rejoicing, to the only God our Saviour, through Jesus Christ our Lord, be glory, majesty, and authority, before all time and now and forever. Amen. Jude 24-25

Christ the King Sunday, now becoming known as the Reign of Christ Sunday, celebrates the Lordship of Jesus Christ, who rules over heaven and earth now and forever. It comes at the culmination of the church year, nicely gathering all the times of the church year, from the celebratory seasons (Advent through Trinity Sunday) to the ordinary times (Sundays after Pentecost) under Jesus' power.

Christ the King Sunday acknowledges that Jesus is Lord over all things in heaven and on earth. It may not seem so here on earth, what with wars, famines, earthquakes and the like, but there is can be no doubt about it: Jesus reigns.

We should have first clued in when the heavens split open and the angels spilled out singing, "Glory to the newborn king!" But we can be forgiven for missing that one. Only the shepherds saw and heard it, and even though they shared the story, who listens to shepherds?

The KING of GLORY The star would be another clue. Whatever it was, it attracted the attention of some foreign star gazers, who traveled far to seek the "one who is born king of the Jews." But again, foreigners. Stargazers. Who listens?

The most substantial clue of all, was Jesus' astounding victory over death. Bursting forth from the tomb, alive forevermore could mean nothing else: Jesus rules even over death. He appeared to over five hundred people after his death, disciples all. Yet, many choose not to believe; it could have been an elaborate ruse.

The Gospel writer John begins his work by saying, "He came to his own, and his own did not receive him. But to all who did receive him, he gave the power to become the children of God."

John saw and believed. Saul saw and believed (and changed his name to Paul). Millions down through the ages have seen and believed. The story goes on.

But Jesus' reign is not predicated upon our belief. Jesus is Lord. Period. Whether we choose to believe and live under his lordship or not, Jesus is Lord. Always has been and evermore shall be.

As God's people we celebrate Jesus' lordship daily by living as disciples of Jesus Christ. We order our lives, make our decisions, choose the words we speak and the actions we do, all in light of Jesus' lordship over our lives. And we long for the day when the full power of Jesus' reign will be evident to all.

Since that day has not come, we celebrate and anticipate Jesus' Lordship with worship and praise on Christ the King Sunday. We confess that Jesus is Lord, and we begin our anticipation of that great and glorious day when every knee shall bow and tongue confess Jesus as Lord. It is an important day of worship. Will we see you there?


In November we will meet on the 8th and 22nd.
